#### SEE THE CAL HEIGHTS HOME **TOUR FOR FREE!**

As many of you know the California Heights Neighborhood Association and Long Beach Heritage jointly host an annual home and garden tour here in California Heights. What you might not know is that it takes approximately 100-150 volunteers to make this event happen. While the volunteers assist with a variety of things the majority of them participate as docents on the day of the tour. The problem is that we never seem to have enough docents. Each house requires three shifts of about four to five docents and there are six homes. So the tour requires a minimum of 90-100 docents. We could use a lot more help, only two hours of your time!

#### What does a docent do?

It is not a complicated task. Docents act as tour guides in each of the tour's homes and gardens. Docents are assigned to one of the houses on the tour and are given a "script" describing a few key architectural features of the house and some of the changes the house may or may not have gone through over the years. Four to five docents are usually assigned to each house (depending on the size of the home) for a two-hour shift and each docent only works one shift.


#### New Historic Preservation Officer

After a six-month search Cindy Thomack has been named the city's new neighborhood and historic preservation officer. Ms. Thomack has a master's degree in historic preservation and a bachelor's degree in parks, recreation and leisure services. She has been an environmental review specialist in the Michigan State Historic Preservation Office and was the historic preservation officer in Grand Rapids.

Long Beach's historic preservation officer evaluates neighborhoods and buildings for historic designation and serves as the staff member of the Cultural Heritage Commission, which reviews requests for designation, additions, demolition and remodeling permit requests for homes in existing districts or landmarks.


