president's message A MESSAGE FROM JOHN ROYCE

When change takes place over time it often escapes our attention, passing by as imperceptible nuances. Unless we take a step back to look at the before and after, we fail to recognize our accomplishments.

Like you'll read in Blair's article (pg 11), we have much to celebrate. When I discovered Bixby Knolls over twenty years ago, it represented what was. Atlantic Avenue on that day was uninviting, the heat reflecting off the sun bleached window displays in the Touch of Travel office where I had stopped in to pick up airline tickets. When I left, I walked up the street to check out a few more shops, but the heat and empty store fronts led me back into the air-conditioned comfort of my car.

After the hair-raising blind back-up from the angled parking stall, I turned right on Marshall, then again on Olive Avenue. "Where am I?" I thought, passing the character rich homes. When I crossed Bixby Road and passed beneath Olive Avenue's canopy of old camphor trees, I fell in love with the old cottages and bungalows of Cal Heights. Unbeknownst to me, I drove past the house that would eventually become my home.

We barely knew that Long Beach existed beyond the no man's land across 7th Street! We also had no idea how involved I would become in my own little way in affecting the transformation my partner and I imagined when we made this place our home. Hundreds of trees soften the urban landscape, inviting pedestrians to linger and explore, vacant lots and parkways became gardens, and numerous unique shops and restaurants continue to discover the benefits of our local Renaissance, where we bump into neighbors and friends that share our community. Despite protracted economic stagnation, First Fridays blossomed from a couple folks hanging out at Chroma Glass to thousands of happy faces strolling, spending, eating and socializing in our backyard playground! Much of the success has depended upon the partnerships we're proud to be part of.

On Wardlow Road, our Cal Heights volunteers have again contributed to the emerging transformation. Our Clean Streets volunteers, who celebrate four years of Thursday morning cleanups in August, have removed thousands of pounds of litter, weeds and graffiti and engaged business owners to take part in a renewed face for the Wardlow Strip. We've already planted 42 trees to augment the new street and sidewalks, and just like we did on Atlantic, our ReLeaf volunteers commit to seeing them through to maturity.

Let's celebrate by continuing to shop and dine locally, play at First Fridays and Concerts in the Park(ing Lot), but let's also continue to improve! Please join us on Saturday, August 10th, from 4-10 pm for the first Cal Heights Summer Festival on the Wardlow Strip, hosted by Roxanne's Lounge, as we raise funds, celebrate and bring attention to the possibilities of our southern border. *





First, I want to thank everyone who joined me for the 4th of July Concert at Willow Springs Park. Attendance was more than anticipated with over 1,000 guests. Please let me know if you have feedback; I look forward to making next year's event even better.

Recently, I was pleased to kickoff "Be S.A.F.E." (Summer Activities in a

Friendly Environment). This program provides safe recreational opportunities for youth during summer evenings in Long Beach. By providing positive activities for the hours we know young people are most at risk of being involved in gang activity, we are developing character in our youth as opposed to leaving them to the streets. Be S.A.F.E., which is offered at Admiral Kidd Park among other locations, is a public-private partnership in which non-profit resources allow us to do more with less.

Also, the numbers for 2013 are in - we saved over \$21.4 million citywide with our preventative street maintenance program. By adopting this approach, we are maintaining our streets before they deteriorate and require replacement at a far greater cost, thus both improving our streets and saving significant taxpayer dollars over the long run. You'll be able to see these efficiencies in real life as we're doing record amounts of street work this year in all parts of the 7th District, including the Bixby Knolls area. This year we will be repairing or maintaining more streets than we have in many years!

Finally, don't forget our $3^{\rm rd}$ Annual BBQ and Croquet Tournament is quickly approaching. Join your $7^{\rm th}$ District neighbors and I at Somerset Park on August $18^{\rm th}$ at 1 PM. I will provide the BBQ and drinks. Feel free to bring your favorite side dish to share with your neighbors, though I'd like you to join us even if you can't. The Croquet Tournament winner will bring home a trophy. This is a free event for all $7^{\rm th}$ District Residents. 

Does your block have an active Community Watch group? If not, I highly encourage you take part in our LBPD crime prevention program that invites individual groups to work closely with the

police to affect crime.

Community Watch encourages participants to keep a watchful eye, not only on the block where they live but the community as a whole, and report suspicious and potential criminal behavior. Community Watch begins with a block approach and expands to include others in the surrounding area and scope of influence. Participants are encouraged to reach out to businesses, nearby schools, and non-profit organizations to get to know each other and communicate.

To get started, first define your Community Watch group, usually 12 to 20 homes or businesses. Everyone on your block should be invited, including neighbors on the next block. School or faith based representatives, and community leaders should be considered. Purposely excluding renters or specific people causes tension and may make some residents feel ignored or discriminated against.

Second, at least one person per group needs to volunteer as the liaison, known as the Community Contact, usually the individual who gets the group started. He/she should live or work on the block and should not be an absentee property owner or businessperson.



The big box retailers like Ralphs and OSH have major internal issues within their corporate structure that are far beyond our control. We hate to see these businesses close but their issues are ones we cannot do much about.

However, we are here to tell you that the sky is not falling! There is so much positive momentum in the area and we are seeing more and more investment in Bixby Knolls than ever before. People are buying buildings and making improvements; businesses are relocating to Bixby Knolls because it's a "hot" neighborhood; retail spaces are being filled along Atlantic Avenue; service businesses are moving onto Long Beach Blvd; two new restaurants will open up in the area; the BKBIA continues the facade improvements, security patrols, and monthly events and programs; Cal Heights Clean Streets keep the corridors spotless each week; the former Blockbuster space on Roosevelt & LB Blvd has been leased and will get a major face lift and same for the former Arnold's property; and a real estate agent told us that people referring to the April Sunset Magazine article are coming to look for houses in the area. City Manager Pat West says other parts of the city are looking at Bixby Knolls as a model for communitybuilding. We ask that you continue supporting our smaller businesses that make up the backbone of our area. There is a lot to celebrate and be proud of in Bixby Knolls.
