Longtime Cal Heights Resident Reflects on Changes

Helen Wilson, 91, has lived in California Heights since 1954. She loves her neighborhood, cares about her community and knows most of her neighbors. Initially, however, she had mixed feelings about moving to Long Beach.

A Minnesota native, she originally came to Hollywood with dreams of becoming a singer and her husband Harvey had been living in the LA area. Harvey, a dentist, had been sharing a practice with another dentist and was ready for a change. He had narrowed it down to a practice in South Gate or Long Beach. Helen explained, "We didn't know which one to choose at first. I wasn't sure I would

like Long Beach. Up until then my only knowledge of the city involved the navy and retired farmers from lowa."

In the end, it was California Heights schools that led to their decision. "We had a 5-yearold son and a toddler, and the schools in South Gate were overcrowded. We learned that Longfellow Elementary was a good school so we drove around the immediate area looking for a house. The closest house was on Lime Avenue so we bought it."

Helen was very close with her neighbors. They had block parties and everyone knew each other. She thinks back on all the people who used to live in the neighborhood when they first moved in. "A plumber lived on the 3600 block of Lime Ave. Jerry Heard was the best plumber in the area. He lived there until he died. A city manager and a councilman lived on the 3700 block of Lime," she recalled. "The person across the street owned a machine shop. He and his wife were from Texas. They had one son and eventually moved back to Texas. Many wonderful people have come and gone."

Helen has fond memories of the shops and restaurants around Atlantic Avenue as well. She remembers seeing the Sound of Music with her children at the Crest Theater. She and her family would go to Thrifty's Drug Store to get treats and ice cream. One of their favorite restaurants was El Patio, which was across the street from where Baja Sonora is now. There were two drive-in diners. She got all of her flowers from a huge nursery that was between Linden, Elm, Wardlow and E. 36^{th} Street.

"There was a market on Orange Avenue and Wardlow Road where the ballet studio now is and a market where the restaurant supply place now is. (cont'd on page 3)



On May 3rd, City Council unanimously approved my agenda item that seeks to use our street repair dollars more efficiently, saving \$30 million over the next 20 years. My item calls for the City to use a portion of each year's street budget on preventative maintenance for our streets instead of waiting to fix them after they

have failed. This is smart financially as it costs many times more to repave or reconstruct streets than it does to maintain them. In these tough economic times, it is one of my priorities to actively explore new ways of saving the city money and using your tax dollars more efficiently and effectively.

On May 21st, local residents joined me for the grand opening of Long Beach's newest and largest dog park, Wrigley Heights Dog Park. This new park is over two acres and has been developed using minimal funds. It is a great example of how we can turn an unused property into a positive use for the whole community. Bring your dogs and enjoy the park. Wrigley Heights Dog Park is located at 3400 Golden Avenue.

I want to thank everyone who joined the CHNA and I for the California Gardens (AKA Willow Spring Gulch) clean up. With the help of over 60 volunteers, we were able to remove an impressive 3.61 tons of trash and debris from the property. If you haven't had a chance to visit California Gardens, please join me on Wednesday, June 29th at 5:30pm for a tour of this 55-acre property. Dominguez Gap Wetlands in Spring - The Perfect Nature Hike

It's been three years since the Dominguez Gap Wetlands were opened to the public. As

Cal Heights residents, we are close to the wetlands and Spring is a perfect time to see the flora and fauna at it's best. Winter rains and three years of maturity have allowed the wetlands to truly establish themselves and the native plants are in full Spring bloom.

The wetlands are an East Basin, 30-acre restoration site created alongside the Los Angeles River from Del Amo Avenue to the north and Wardlow Avenue to the south. It is the first completed project of its kinds in the LA River Master Plan and features aspects like flood control, water quality improvement, environmental enhancements with recreational and educational opportunities.

A recent tour sponsored by the U.S. Green Building Council, Long Beach chapter, described how the wetlands were created from flows off the LA River and Long Beach area storm drains. This water is naturally treated by wetlands' plant life before it reaches the San Pedro Harbor. Wetland ponds have become a home for frogs, turtles, ducks, and various bird species including the red-winged blackbird and occasional visits from herons and brown hawks. Among the plant life you will see sage, sycamores, cottonwoods, California poppies and species native to the riparian environment.

The wetlands offer an easy two mile hike on maintained trails for walking, biking and horseback riding. Visitors can enjoy slopes with native scrub giving a glimpse into the past when the LA River had lush, seasonal, natural vegetation. The trails are free to the public and can be accessed via Del Amo Avenue near Oregon Avenue. Street parking is available. The trail can also be caught off Del Mar Avenue in Los Cerritos-Virginia Country Club. Just take San Antonio Drive west to the 4100 block of Del Mar Avenue near Terralynn Place. You will see the trail opening through the Eucalyptus grove on Del Mar Avenue. Please note, dogs must be leashed and the trails are closed during stormy weather.

So grab your hiking boots and binoculars and check out the wetlands in their full Spring splendor. $\mbox{\$}$
