Need Summer Plans? Consider Hosting a Foreign Exchange Student!

Imagine yourself as a teenager, fresh out of your first year in high school, Mom and Dad tell you you're getting the trip of a lifetime. You get to go to another country, live with a host family and immerse yourself in that family's language, life, culture and community.

That scenario is a reality for 24 European students, ranging from 14 to 18 years old, coming to our neck of the woods this summer to improve their English skills. The only issue is we need host families!!! The students participating in the 2013 Summer Program through Nacel Open Door (nacelopendoor. org) will be in the greater Long Beach area from July 8 – August 1. They attend "school" Monday – Friday from 9:00 am – 5:00 pm and work in a 4:1 student/teacher ratio where they practice conversational English in a classroom setting for half the day and go on daily excursions practicing language skills in public the other half. We take them to most of the landmark Southern California tourist sites from the Hollywood Sign and Santa Monica Pier to Crystal Cove and Huntington Beach in the other direction.

The host family's only responsibilities include providing a clean bed for them to sleep in and 3 square meals a day (including a daily sack lunch for school). In exchange you get the chance to create a lifetime of family memories while getting to know your student.

And if hosting a teenager doesn't appeal to you, two adult chaperons need to be placed as well! What an amazing opportunity for both the host family and student to appreciate life in another part of the world. Another benefit of becoming a host family; you have someone to visit when you go to Europe!!

Congratulations to Hughes Middle

School! We became a National Green Ribbon School on Earth Day! The US Secretary of Education announced it. We're one of only 64 selected schools nationwide. What makes Hughes stand out among Green Schools? We have recycled over 120 TONS of material and are 3-time LA County recycling champions. We have made 18,000 square feet of gardens, including a vegetable garden and compost center. We collect almost 1,700 pounds of uneaten packaged food, milk, and fruit from the cafeteria every month for the Salvation Army. We run eco-community service projects every month and irrigate our landscaping with reclaimed water. We were awarded the US EPA Energy Star 2012 energy conservation award, with a perfect score of 100. Yea Hughes!

On April 20th, Hughes participated in Grow-ECO at Long-fellow Elementary, an Earth Day celebration that was put together by the City of Long Beach Environmental Services Department. Hughes hosted 3 booths at the event: the 3rd Annual Free Community Document Shred, the 2nd Annual Green Team Plant Sale, and a "DIY" Reusable Sandwich Bag Workshop. Over 25 Green Team students worked the event. We helped people carry their documents to the shred truck, sold plants, and sewed at the workshop table. At the end of the day, Hughes shredded 5,300 pounds of documents, sold \$2,600 dollars of plants, and sewed over 200 reusable cloth sandwich bags! Stanford Middle School, Jefferson Middle School, Poly High School and Longfellow Elementary participated.





It's been a busy few months here in the 7th District. I've been working with LBUSD on two important projects. I worked with City Prosecutor Doug Haubert, LBUSD Board Member Felton Williams, and school officials to open the first "Teen Court" in Long Beach at Cabrillo High School. Area teenagers charged with real misdemeanors (such as graffiti or vandalism) are

judged by other teens, with real Superior Court judges and lawyers supervising. Youth who go through this program are diverted from the traditional juvenile justice system, and thus are given a chance to keep a clean record upon completion of their sentence through Teen Court.


Also, the Joint Use Committee between LBUSD and the City of LB, which I chair, has initiated a forum on how to best prevent bullying. Thanks to Vice-Mayor Garcia, Councilmember Neal, and School Board Members Williams and Stanton for all working together. Let's stand together with our children and send a clear message--bullying is not welcome in Long Beach.

Summer is approaching, meaning a host of fun activities for you and your family. First up is the 4^{th} of July Concert at Willow Springs Park. Your LBPD North Division front As the summer season approaches, Long Beach Police Department and I want to remind all community members that taking precautions with your property, both house

and car, may prevent you from becoming a victim of crime.

Help us to reduce crime and protect your valuable property by employing the following tips regularly:

- Lock doors and windows every time you go out.
- Don't leave cash, jewelry, iPods, iPads, GPS systems, purses and laptops in plain sight.
- Trim bushes and trees to keep your house, front door and address visible from the street.
- Leave lights on at night, install motion lights around your property.
- Keep a radio or TV on during the day.
- Never leave your car running unattended.
- Always close windows and lock your car even in hot weather.
- Invest in home alarms and anti-theft vehicle devices.
- Keep a copy of your license plate and vehicle identification numbers.
- If your vehicle is stolen, report it immediately.

I also remind parents that Section 9.58.010 of the Long Beach Municipal Code states: It is unlawful for any minor under the age of eighteen years to remain in or at any 'public place' between the hours of 10:00 pm and 6:00 am. We take curfew violations seriously. Our experience has shown that children/youth on the street after curfew are more likely to become victims of violent crime, or become involved in criminal behavior. Parents should know the whereabouts of their children at all times and ensure they get home safely before curfew. The Long Beach Police Department strictly enforces the curfew statutes through the summer.


