



While this can wear away the bark and kill even a mature tree, the tender tissue of young trees are especially vulnerable, and it continues to be the number one reason we lose our ReLeaf planted trees. 
The Harvest Round-Up will have delicious food, exciting games, great music and a scarecrow contest-vote for your favorite.
