#### Why a Home Tour?

By now most of you understand the importance of our Home & Garden Tours, but some of our newer residents may wonder just what it's all about. In the first few years following California Heights' historic designation in 1990, the fledgling board determined to establish a sense of place and unique identity for the neighborhood by undertaking an ambitious project to restore the vintage lampposts and explore other community improvement projects. The Home & Garden Tours were born to finance those projects, which continue today, but also to exemplify the value that maintaining our historic character, could offer everyone, and hopefully stop or slow down the incremental destruction of the unique architecture and charming fabric that set our neighborhood apart. While some questionable and unfortunate projects still take place today, the effort has slowed the rate of deterioration. Local realtor and Home & Garden Tour primary sponsor, Lewis Ebersole, notes that during the severe economic downtown, Cal Heights weathered the storm with far less severity than other similar but non-historic local neighborhoods and those homes that maintained their historic integrity and charm sold much more quickly and for significantly higher prices.

Our tours have raised over \$100,000 that has been reinvested back into the neighborhood, funding ongoing and past projects like the Cal Heights Mural by Art Mortimer, our historic district street signs, tree plantings and care efforts, Clean Streets litter pickups and alley cleanups and our signature lamppost restoration project that started it all. The Home & Garden Tour efforts have been made possible thanks to countless volunteer hours over the years, the dedicated generosity of homeowners willing to open their homes and gardens, and thousands of paying guests who enjoy the Cal Heights charm and appreciate the value that maintaining our historic integrity offers. With robust returns, we hope to complete the lamppost project with a final installation of replicate vintage tops in 2014.

Popular shelter magazines had completely ignored the bungalow in favor of Victorian and Early American styles. 

#### From the 7<sup>th</sup> District

After years of tough budget decisions, for the first time in a decade, we have a budget surplus. The budget passed by City Council begins to reinvest in our city.

It is important to reflect on how we came back to fiscal health. We faced our problems headon. While some other cities endlessly deferred maintenance, we

increased our spending on infrastructure, realizing that letting our assets deteriorate does not save money but simply shifts the rapidly escalating costs to future budgets. We reinstituted our street maintenance budget, which had previously been eliminated in 2003. We increased tree trimming to get back to a standard trim cycle, instead of waiting for overgrown or diseased trees to fall and damage property. We worked in partnership with our employees to reform pensions, saving \$215 million over the next ten years. This year's budget will also allow for responsible investments to improve quality of life for our residents, including an additional \$400,000 for libraries, almost \$8 million extra dollars for infrastructure like streets, sidewalks, and parks, as well as \$2.46 million for reserves and unfunded liabilities.

As you know, the City was awarded a grant to plant 6,000 trees in the western parts of our city. The  $7^{\text{th}}$  District is leading the way, with more plantings than any other district and we hope to extend our lead. On October  $5^{\text{th}}$ , I will be co-hosting a tree planting with the BKBIA and the CHNA. Contact me if you'd like a tree in the parkway in front of your home or if you'd like to help us plant trees.

Finally, you've likely noticed the construction on Orange Ave. The Water Department is upgrading their equipment at Orange and Wardlow in preparation for the upcoming repaving of Orange Avenue. Like we did on Wardlow Road, we are trying to do as much utility work as possible now so that we can avoid ripping up a brand new street later. Orange Avenue reconstruction is slated to begin this fall. While the construction has been long, it will result in a brand new street which will be a big improvement for the neighborhood.

The Dana Library has been the beneficiary of much neighborhood support throughout the years. As I thought about the topic for this column, I decided everyone probably knew school was starting, but many may not know about some of the support the Dana Library receives from our patrons and neighbors. Here are a few of the volunteer projects and donations:


The library is very proud of our front garden, and it was a volunteer project almost 10 years ago. Exclusively native Southern California plants (except maybe one or two) the garden was installed by a group of volunteers led by John Royce. The old plants were removed, a drip system put in, and the beautiful plants you see thriving there today were planted. The garden is still maintained on a volunteer basis by John Royce, who stops by periodically to tidy up and control the wild nature of some of the plants.

Dana Library has also been the recipient of **two Eagle Scout projects in the past few years.** The first was the ship sign in front of the library. Using the library's seafaring namesake as an inspiration, Matthew Jones designed, built, and installed the sign for his Eagle Scout project. The other Eagle Scout project is inside the library and unless you are attending one of the weekly story times, you probably won't see it. In 2009, Luke Higbee designed, built, and delivered a lovely cabinet to store the toys, props, and oversized books used during story time.


The Bixby Knolls/North Long Beach Kiwanis is also a strong supporter of the library, but they aren't doing construction projects. No, what they do is donate a children's book in honor of their guest speaker each month. Perhaps you have seen their bookplate in one of the almost 30 books they have already given the library? The library has received titles for kids of all ages by authors ranging from Dr. Seuss to Carl Hiaasen. The Bixby Knolls Literary Society also has a presence in the library. Each month Blair Cohn donates that month's title to the "Bixby Knolls Literary Society Collection." The collection is nearly complete with just a few of the earliest titles missing.

The library thanks these organizations and individuals, as well as our "regular" volunteers, who help out with less visible or glamorous projects and programs. \*

The kids are back in school and fall is here! Please remember that our local streets are filled once again with kids heading to and from school in the mornings and afternoons; extra caution ensures safety for all. Also, Halloween

is just around the corner, so please take precautions while planning holiday outings and events to keep it safe and fun.

- Be sure your child's activities are age-appropriate
- All children should be accompanied by an adult
- Only visit well lighted homes; never go into a stranger's house
- Stay on the sidewalk and only cross at corners
- Stay in well populated areas; never cut through alleys or parks
- Apply reflective tape to costumes; use glow sticks for visibility
- Use face paint instead of masks that may block vision
- Map out routes ahead of time and carry a flash light
- Ensure tips of props (pitchfork, sword, etc.) are smooth
- Be cautious of animals and keep pets indoors
- Inspect candy before eating
- Program LBPD's non-emergency number, (562) 435-6711, into your cell phone and report any suspicious or illegal activity immediately, or 9-1-1 for emergencies.

Reminder: Curfew law prohibits anyone 17 years old or younger from being out past 10 pm without a parent/guardian, unless going to or returning home from work or an organized event supervised by an adult, without detours or stops. \*

#### **Local Tree Plantings**


