With no plots left to sell, there's little income for water, grounds keeping and pest control, let alone removal of dead trees and improvements. Our gracious volunteers work hard, but the to-do list remains daunting and costly.

On June 30th, thanks to a wonderful community partnership with Festival Obscura, we hosted a craft beer festival to determine if we had the capacity to raise enough funds to make a difference. We did! Many familiar Cal Heights faces attended and helped make A Celebration at Sunnyside a wonderful financial success and a hopeful sign for our mission's future. We can't thank you enough and look forward to our next festival.

Until then, the fundraising continues as Festival Obscura's Sunnyside Cemetery Cinema kicks off with family friendly summer movie favorites every other Saturday: **July 21st** - Who Framed Roger Rabbit with 30th anniversary showcase; **August 4th** - Back to the Future with DeLorean showcase; **August 18th** - Monster Squad; **September 1st** - Dazed and Confused with muscle car showcase; **September 15th** - Bill and Ted's Excellent Adventure; **September 29th** - Pee Wee's Big Adventure with retro bicycle showcase; **October 13th** - Horror movie night TBA. Live music, food trucks, and art vendors round out the fun.

Gates open at 6pm and movies begin at dusk. Parking is limited, so carpools, Uber, Lyft, and taxis are strongly encouraged. No pets, please. Picnic blankets and low back chairs are welcomed to prevent obstructed viewing. Cal Heights Looking Back


"Where were you in 1962?" Did you love the movie American Graffiti? What was your favorite thing; the innocent times, the music or all the great classic cars? Long Beach had its share of great car clubs in the 50's and 60's. Fast, customized or borrowed from Mom and Dad, cars were the ticket to the frenzy that was the teenage car cruising circuit. But not all car clubs were the same. The Cut Outs of Long Beach were much more the Ron Howard than the Harrison Ford in that iconic movie.

Ron Dulin is a born and bred Cal Heights guy growing up on 37th and Gaviota. While a Junior at LB Poly, he was asked to join the Cut Outs, a car club that started in 1941. "The Cut Outs choose your car first and you second," Ron recalled. You and your car had to be worthy to carry the Cut Outs plaque. The club had a constitution, by-laws, and members took an oath to be good citizens. "The club taught you organization, cooperation, and responsibility. We even carried business cards that we would hand out to stranded motorists that we would assist," Ron said.

The Cut Outs even affiliated with the LB police to promote car safety. An 18 year old Ron was chosen to participate in a test to see if speeding really paid off. Ron and another driver were given a set route to follow. While the 'good' driver simply had to follow all the rules of the road Ron was encouraged to speed all he wanted. Ron did beat the other driver to the finish line and was given a cigarette to smoke while waiting on the other driver to arrive. The moral of this tortoise and hare story was that speeding only saved you the time it took to smoke a single cigarette. An article in the Press-Telegram showed Ron smoking a cigarette beside a clock. "My mother was not amused," Ron said with a chuckle.

When asked why join a car club Ron stated "you became part of a whole family who had pride in what they did. I worked hard to save money and customize my car. I simply loved cars."

As the summer evenings grow longer, you can imagine yourself riding with Ron in his '56 Fury cruising down Atlantic to stop at The Clock Drive-in and meet the gang.
















July 4th was a day for remembrance and rejoice. Unfortunately, we had individuals act outside of the law. I heard some community members concerns about the illegal activities and we continue to push forward to implement new strategies and curbing methods. Below I have outlined some of the

proactive approaches our City took this Independence Day.

To address community concerns related to fireworks, new enforcement strategies were implemented by the LBPD, shifting its focus from not only the users, but the suppliers as well. The LBPD, through a firework enforcement investigation on June 20th, located several thousand pounds of illegal high-powered fireworks with a street value of approximately \$250,000. Separately, three other investigations resulted in one arrest, one citation, and the confiscation of approximately 3,000 pounds of fireworks, narcotics, a handgun, magazines, and ammunition. On July 4th, police enforcement resulted in 26 felony and misdemeanor arrests, and 32 fireworks and misdemeanor citations.

This year, to better protect our pets, the LB Animal Care Services (ACS) deployed their inaugural "Fireworks Campaign" at the beginning of June. ACS put forth a series of print and social artwork pieces designed to help pet owners keep and calm their pets. The campaign focused on Owner Awareness, Pet Protection, and Dog Fostering. The Owner Awareness campaign spotlighted five pieces of artwork that focused on how to safeguard animals against fireworks. Printed pieces were distributed citywide to local business and store-fronts. The Pet Protection campaign promoted a free give-away of pet tags to owners; in total, 132 pet tags were distributed. Each pet tag was inscribed with the pet owner's information just in case the animal ran away so that owners and pets could be reunited quickly. The Foster the 4th campaign focused on having current shelter dogs fostered for a period of three weeks. Fostering these animals helped make room for run-away dogs brought to the shelter over the July 4th holiday.


