Cherry Avenue Corridor Specific Plan Outreach Meeting By John Moreland

On Wednesday, February 28th, the City of Long Beach Development Services kicked off the former Cherry Avenue Corridor Specific Plan. The new name for this project is the Globemaster Corridor Specific Plan. The goal of this plan is to help with the transition of the former C-17 Globemaster III production facility into an area that will once again bring economic activity into the City. The City received a grant from the Department of Defense Office of Economic Adjustment to prepare this Specific Plan. The City's goal is to replace the economic activity that was lost when the C-17 production ended. Initially, the plan was only to cover properties along Cherry Avenue between Wardlow Road and the 405 freeway, in addition to the former C-17 production properties. However, the City may consider extending the plan to include non-residential properties along Cherry between Carson and Spring Streets.

At this time, no details of the plan have been settled, but at the meeting on the 28th, the City's consultants indicated that the City is leaning toward an office/industrial park for the former C-17 production facilities and commercial/retail businesses along Cherry Avenue near Wardlow Road. Cherry Avenue would include a planted median and street trees. This area has several restrictions due to its proximity to Long Beach Airport. For most of this area, single-family homes, entertainment venues, and other uses that would gather a lot of people in one place, would not be allowed by the Federal Government.

The City has expressed interest in community feedback and will be conducting numerous outreach meetings as the plan is further developed during this 12 to 18 month-long process. The next outreach meeting/workshop is tentatively scheduled for some time in June. Please check our Facebook page for updates as the Globemaster Corridor Specific Plan progresses.

Alley Cleanups for 2018



Cal Heights Looking Back

Edward Killingsworth was a renowned architect. He excelled in mid-century modern design, creating the famous Frank House in Naples, CA and the elegant Kahala Hilton in Hawaii, as well as several homes and buildings right here in Long Beach. You may or may not have seen some of his work, but I bet you have seen the designs of his award-winning son, Kim Killingsworth.


Kim's Long Beach heritage runs deep. His oilman grand-father moved the family from Taft to the Long Beach area to drill some of the first wells in Signal Hill. After serving in WWII, Kim's father graduated from USC and joined the Long Beach architectural firm of Kenneth S. Wing and in 1953 began his own firm.

Kim was born in the Bixby Knolls Maternity Hospital on Atlantic and attended several local schools. He soon discovered school was not always the best fit for him and he learned best by doing. His father helped instill this approach in Kim and his brother, insisting that they help build the family's house he designed in Virginia Country Club. Kim practiced this can-do approach working behind the scenes at the LB Civic Light Opera with his mother Laura. "I learned stagecraft by helping whenever I could," Kim recalled. This experience paved the way for his true calling. He joined Local 33, the stagehand union, and began accepting any job he could find, often working on several projects at the same time.

Kim's resume includes teaching stagecraft at Long Beach City College, Technical Director at the Downey Theater and a long stint at CBS Television in the Lighting Department, along with numerous other projects like concerts with Fleetwood Mac and regional theatre. While he is talented in many aspects of stagecraft, lighting design is where he excelled. He has been nominated for seven Emmys, winning twice! He has won three Drama-Logue Awards, Showcase Magazine's Designer of the Year, and many others.

Even after projects that took him all over the world, Kim still keeps his boyhood home close to his heart by volunteering at the Historical Society of Long Beach.

So where have you seen his work? General Hospital, The Wayne Brady Show, Big Brother, Will and Grace, theatrical productions like the national touring companies of A Chorus Line, Evita and Fiddler in the Roof, TV movies Failsafe and On Golden Pond, and dozens and dozens other award shows, plays, game shows and - one of my favorites - Whose Line Is It Anyway?



All candidates answered questions related to the current land use element, the 710 freeway expansion, the Southern California gateway project, public safety, the oil's operator property, and bike transit.





From the 7th

Welcome to a New Year! I am excited for this year and ready to continue working with each one of you to improve the 7th! I would like to share with you the improvements we've made benefitting the 7th District from July 2014 to present:

- 31 street blocks were paved/slurry sealed. 3.46 center line miles of streets were paved and 3.48 center line miles of streets were slurry sealed
- 9,589 street and alley potholes were repaired
- 6,421 trees were trimmed and 701 new trees were planted
- 20,042 graffiti sites were abated and 181 removals of graffiti from traffic signs
- 1,192 sidewalks were patched/repaired and sidewalks at 138 blocks of streets were replaced
- 886 traffic signs were repaired and 71 street markings were repainted
- 586 street sweeper signs were replaced
- 145 ADA ramps were installed
- Admiral Kidd Artificial Turf Field, field lighting, landscape and irrigation was just completed
- Dana Branch Library improvements will be done this month: lighting, rest room and circulation desk improvements for enhanced service. They are also looking into the possibility of installing hearing loops in the community room for the hearing impaired.
- Cherry Park playground also went through improvements and is currently under repair of the aging irrigation system.
