New Covid-19 Testing Locations

Last month, due to increased cases of COVID-19, the Long Beach Health Department opened an expanded drive-thru and walk-up testing site for residents.

With the capacity to test 3,000 people a day, the public testing clinic will be located in the former Boeing parking lot, near 3590 E. Wardlow Road. The Boeing site will be open from 9:30 a.m. to 1 p.m. and 2:30 to 5 p.m. weekdays.

Health Department officials said people should get tested if any symptoms are present or if they have been in close contact with someone who has or is suspected to have the virus, regardless of vaccination status.

Appointments strongly suggested: Individuals who do not have access to the Internet or need assistance making an appointment online can call the City's Information Line at (562) 570-INFO (4636) (open Monday - Friday, 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.). All appointments are for PCR tests. Rapid antigen testing is available upon request at the testing site. Below is a partial list of locations near California Heights, for more details visit longbeach.gov/covid19testing.



Cal Heights Looking Back

Did you ever come across an old photo album, open it and wonder what the story was behind each snapshot? Maybe the photo is of a beautiful beach scene in the 60's or a cute house with two young boys playing outside or even a photo of a newly minted graduate of the Los Angeles Police Academy proudly standing at attention. If you are lucky enough to know Cal Heights neighbor, George Janquart, you get to see each of those snapshots come alive.

Born in Fort Knox, George came to Long Beach as a young boy. As George and I talked I was amazed at his incredible memory, often recalling names, dates, and events as if they occurred yesterday. As he regaled me of his youth, I could see a snapshot of his time as a track star running the halfmile for a school record at Long Beach Jordan, his days as the Student Body President at LBCC, and even running the concessions down at the beach where he was lucky enough to meet his future wife, Maryanne.

His 26 years in the LAPD could have filled several albums, including encounters with criminals, fighting with an irate man, and finding a burglar who actually chose to hide under the bed. One funny encounter involved confronting a naked man carrying a surfboard, but we won't take a snapshot of that! His law enforcement career took him from the beaches in Venice, to the docks of San Pedro, to working with the Scientific Investigation Division, to helping to train and certify officers at the San Pedro Pistol Range (where once a civilian wanted to practice shooting his elephant gun).

The many diverse moments of George's life include mentoring young boys, including his own young sons, in the Boy Scouts; hiking Mount Whitney; serving 21 years in the Army Reserve; and teaching Woodshop to 8th grade boys (which may have prepared him for the rigors of the LAPD).

George and Maryanne came to Cal Heights in 1973 after George saw the neighborhood while carpooling with a co-worker. Here they have raised their two sons, made countless friends, created wonderful memories and given so much back to our neighborhood. George has volunteered for the Home Tour, is active in the weekly Clean Streets litter abatement program and helps deliver our newsletter-where I was fortunate to have met him.

Each of us create these snapshots of our lives every day. Just like George and Maryanne we are lucky to have our life's album full of the many things that living in Cal Heights brings us: community, friends, and family.



Cal Heights Welcomes Meat & Vino Market

Meat & Vino Market is now up and thriving in Cal Heights, and we have a feeling you're going to like it. The shop, which opened December 4, 2021, is located on Wardlow, just west of Myrtle.

Meat & Vino Market is owned and operated by Al Valadez and his wife, Diana, and, according to Al, is a boutique-style butcher and wine shop with an emphasis on pairings. The shop has an upscale, elegant vibe and a well-stocked butcher counter featuring restaurant-quality cuts, most of which can't be found at a typical grocery store.

"With our beef, we don't do anything other than Certified Angus Beef—which is also known as Upper Choice or Prime—and wagyu." Al said. "We also have a little bit of lamb, chicken, pork, and some seafood. We try to bring in a little bit of everything."

Store shelves are packed with a variety of unique rubs, sauces, spices, snacks, tools, and charcoals to help customers cook the meats properly and to amp up their flavor.

"Everything in the shop should pair up with wine or a craft beer, and we're really selective about the items we bring in," Al said. "So if you grab a bottle of wine, there are all kinds of cheeses, charcuterie options, and snacks—all of these things will pair up to make your eating experience more flavorful."

Al and Diana are on-hand to provide information about how to successfully prepare the cuts, and about which wines and/or craft beers will pair best with customer selections. Pamphlets, printed on heavy card-stock, feature recipes, cooking tips, and pairing suggestions, so customers can take their cooking experience to the next level.

"A lot of people don't know what to do with a nice piece of steak, and you can really ruin a nice piece of steak if you don't cook it properly," Al said. "So this is just a little bit more information, and it gives the customer an experience to come to the butcher shop."

Meat & Vino Market is located at 901 East Wardlow Road, and is open weekdays from 11 a.m. to 7 p.m., and weekends from 10 a.m. to 7 p.m. For more information, visit meatand-vino.com, or call (562) 283-3002.


