# **Cal Heights Looking Back**

Did you ever imagine yourself as the hero of one of your favorite novels? Perhaps you saw yourself in a Tom Clancy book full of intrigue, danger, and finally nabbing the bad guy. Or maybe a quieter approach like the heroine in Elizabeth Spann Craig's novels about a sharp-minded dogooder who creates masterpiece quilts while solving the town's problems. If you combine the two, add a vintage '57 T-Bird, lots of family, and a 165-pound St. Bernard named Jellybean, you just met Cal Heights neighbors Lynn and Linda Williams.

Lynn, a graduate of Arizona State, was a hard-working teacher when a show about the "Secret Service" intrigued him enough to apply to become an agent. While waiting for a job to open up, he instead switched to the U.S. Customs Service. Talking with Lynn was like getting a real-life history lesson. I was amazed to learn that the first U.S. Customs Administration was created in 1789 by Congress to provide revenue to the new nation by collecting duties and tariffs. In the time right after the Revolutionary War the nation was deeply in debt and had no way to collect domestic taxes yet. For the next 122 years revenue collected by U.S. Customs was responsible for building Washington D.C., making both the Louisiana Purchase and Alaska Purchase, and the construction of the transcontinental railroad. Criminal activity to avoid customs also began, and as a Special Agent, Lynn was involved with catching the culprits. "I found it challenging," Lynn said. Narcotic violators used burn phones, false names, and unique ways to smuggle contraband into the country.

Lynn proudly told me of his wife Linda's accomplishments as well, including the incredible quilts displayed in the home. Linda's quilts have won many ribbons in competition but she also donates many to neighbors, friends, and the VA Hospital. Along with several other members of the Cal Heights Methodist Church, Linda helped open one of the first preschools in the area in 1973. "We wanted a place where children could develop physically, socially, and prepare for Kindergarten." The church still offers preschool, but also offers after-school programs and more!

The Williams moved to Cal Heights in 1972 and shortly after began to buy homes in the area, eventually helping all three of their children move nearby, two on the same street and the other right behind them. "It's wonderful to have all the family so close," Linda said. Lynn heartily agreed "Cal Heights is like an 'Island Unto Itself'." You know that might make a great title for a novel! &

Hello Cal Heights Neighbors,

Happy Spring! As always, I am grateful to the CHNA leadership for including me in this newsletter to share items of interest in District 5.

Long Beach Airport continues to undergo major improvements. One of those improvements includes electrical upgrades designed to improve the safety of the Airport's primary runway and

improve Airport sustainability. These electrical updates require temporary runway closures through July. The Cal Heights neighborhood may experience additional commercial air traffic during daytime hours on Tuesdays and Wednesdays from approximately April 18 to May 24 as a result of Runway 12-30 closures repositioning operations to Runway 8L-26R. As some of you may have heard, the city will operate an RV Sanitation and Water-filling site on 32nd Street east of Cherry Avenue. Set to open in early April, this site will offer supervised services by appointment during scheduled hours. Once confirmed, I will share details with your neighborhood via my Community Newsletter. 

# **Local Business Spotlight: Lindsay Shaver** of DeadRockers

Lindsay Shaver is the owner of DeadRockers, a punk-rock record and clothing store right here in California Heights. Lindsay moved her store here in October after a successful 10-year stint on 4th Street in downtown Long Beach. I met Lindsay, and her "shop dog" Lemmy, at her store on a rainy afternoon in March.

I hear you started out by selling punk-rock merchandise at

That's true. I used to do Derby Dolls—a lot of roller derby events—car shows, punk shows. Pretty much anywhere that was sub-culture-based. There weren't a lot of people doing it back then, which is why I started it in the first place—because I couldn't find what I wanted to buy for myself.

# What sorts of vinyl do you sell at DeadRockers?

Mostly all realms of punk rock, but we have a little bit of metal; we have a little bit of ska. Lately, we've been getting soundtracks that punk bands are featured on. We just got in the "Repo Man" reissue, and we've got "The Shining" soundtrack.

# What about your clothing?

We have punk-rock clothing, shoes and accessories for men and women. We have classic Doc Martins; T.U.K., with the Creepers. Fred Perry we're carrying, too, which is pretty hard to find. I started doing my own women's clothing line in 2019, which is all completely cruelty-free.

How does your new Cal Heights location compare to your previous spot downtown?

The ample parking is huge for us. We are a bit of a destination, because we're so niche, so we have people coming from all over. This larger space allows us to have in-store events, too. We had the band Fear here in December, doing an in-store autograph signing.

Where can people go to learn about your upcoming events? Instagram is the best way. We also do email blasts and text alerts, and there's a place on our website where people can sign up for those. People on those lists can get early access to sales, and get to shop usually two days early.

DeadRockers is located at 1090 E. Wardlow Road in Long Beach. Store hours are Tuesday through Sunday, noon to 6 p.m. Look for DeadRockers on Instagram (@deadrockers), and shop online at deadrockers.net. For more information, call or text (424) 777-3228. 🚙

# Cal Heights Truck Needs A Place to Live

It's funny the things that you become attached to, in my case one of those things happens to be a Model A prop truck with real parts and props. So how did I get so attached to such an unusual item?

Well, around 2003 former Cal Heights president, Albert Guerra, mentioned to our Board, which included me, that he had an interest in a prop Model A display truck that he thought we could use to promote the association and its community projects. I'm sure I probably thought, "what the heck are we going to do with that?" But Albert always had a plan in mind.

Not much later, the truck was acquired and donated to the CHNA - but where would it live? We were holding our meetings at Jan's Antique Mall (at Cerritos and Wardlow) and the owners offered a space for her there. We rolled her in and parked her at the entrance. People entering Jan's Antique Mall would get the information they needed about the CHNA and the neighborhood while browsing for antiques. The antique mall was also our check-in station for home tours and hundreds of people stopped to read information on this funky little truck. She has come out for every home tour since.

For a summer or two, she was outfitted by Albert with a custom candy rack and rolled out for community movie nights where we educated and fundraised by selling popcorn and candy. In 2004, she famously had her picture taken with the Board and appeared in Sunset Magazine when our neighborhood was voted the Best in the West.

Why am I telling you all of this? Our little truck has had issues finding long-term housing. When Jan's Antique Mall closed, she lived covered in the parking lot until a resident stepped up to house her in an empty garage. That lasted a few years and then another generous resident offered to give us a space in his auto storage building. That lasted for several years but then the building was sold, and she needed to be moved again. Our wonderful BKBIA director, Blair Cohn, stepped up at that time to house her at the EXPO on a temporary basis which has bled into a couple of years. But the EXPO is busier these days and she needs to be moved around quite often for events. It's time to find a new place for her to live once again.

We'd love to keep her in the neighborhood, if possible, and are reaching out to all you wonderful residents to see if someone has an empty garage, a section of a warehouse, a contact to a storage facility or some ideas that we haven't thought of yet. Email us at info@calheights.org. &









