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

Summer is here and is in full swing! I've made it through my first 6 months as your Councilwoman, and I am genuinely grateful for the trust you have placed in me. In my first 6 months, my office has had over 2,200 service interactions, 65 community engagements, I have had 20 Council Meetings, 110 city department briefings,

4 committee meetings, 1 legislative trip, supported 14 non-profits, strolled 95 miles within our district, and attended 3 mobility events. These interactions were only possible with your support, engagement, and feedback.

We had to say goodbye to my amazing Senior Advisor, former interim chief-of-staff, superstar constituent services representative, Holly Unruh. Her last day with my office was July 30th. Holly began her tenure with the former Councilwoman in December of 2021. She quickly mastered all things in the new District 5 and became an invaluable resource. She will be greatly missed, and thankfully, she will not be far. She is heading to the Long Beach Health Department to support the incredible work and important initiatives that impact our entire community. We are grateful for her service and wish her all the best.

Since my last entry, our city refuse is improving. There was a city-wide one-day hiring event on July 22, 2023. 

This issue's small-business Q&A is with Greg "Mac" McCormack of Mac's Barber Shop on Wardlow Road in Cal Heights. Greg is the owner and sole practitioner at this old-school shop, which has a unique look with an apple green-and-black color scheme.

How long have you owned this business?

I've been here 25 years, but I've worked in the neighborhood going on 27-and-a-half years.

What's your client-base like?

I get a mixture of young clients and older clients. I've got clients who've been with me the entire time.

If I asked your regular clients why they come to you, what do you think they'd say?

Most of my customers are return customers, and I think they come back because I give a good haircut for a fair price.

How has the neighborhood changed over these years? It's changed a lot over the years, and it's changed for the better. Twenty-seven years ago the neighborhood was pretty sleepy. There weren't a lot of businesses that were open to the public

back then.

Do you prefer customers make an appointment?

I'm appointment-only. It just works out better. People don't have to wait and they don't have to guess when I'm going to be here.

I love the look of this place. Did you choose this cool décor yourself?

I did! Barber shops started looking a lot alike, and I thought I'd do something different. I always change it up, but it's been like this for a little while.

# Living in a Historic District

What is a historic district? It's a lot more than just homes that have unique charm and character. According to the City of Long Beach, "Historic districts are designated neighborhoods that contain groups of older, unaltered houses that preserve the visual qualities and ambience of the past." California Heights is the City of Long Beach's largest historic district with just under 1,500 homes. A number of homes in our neighborhood are over 100 years old. Preserving the past involves more than typical home maintenance - there are rules that govern the design within the neighborhood. Although it is noted in escrow instructions when a home is sold, not everyone is aware of the city-wide Historic District Design Guidelines and the guidelines applicable to California Heights. This information is available at <a href="https://www.longbeach.gov/lbds/planning/preservation/">www.longbeach.gov/lbds/planning/preservation/</a> districts/quidelines. Homeowners looking to improve their house require what is called a Certificate of Appropriateness (COA) for any addition or major work within the front yard. Typical improvements that require a COA can include:

- Any addition onto the house
- Painting the house a new color
- Adding a new fence or wall in the front yard
- Driveway or concrete walkways in the front yard
- Roof replacement
- Window replacement
- Demolition of any structure

The City of Long Beach reviews and issues COAs and some of the smaller tasks such as painting and roof replacement can be handled relatively quickly, provided the color and materials are appropriate for the home. Questions about the COA process should be directed to the Historic Preservation team at the City at 562.570.6194 or via email at <a href="mailto:historicpreservation@">historicpreservation@</a> longbeach.gov. Work that has been completed without a COA may face fines, penalties, and even possibly legal action to remove unapproved elements. It is not worth the trouble and expense to go this route.

Before starting an improvement to the home, owners should review these guidelines. Many contractors that do not work in the City regularly may not know these regulations. Questions should be directed to the City of Long Beach. The benefits of living in a historic district include celebrating unique architectural styles that are beautifully preserved and maintained, a heightened sense of community, and several studies show historic districts enhance property values. Let's ensure that our neighborhood is enjoyed for future residents over the next 100 years.










August business recommendation: The Vintage LBC at 4236 Atlantic Avenue. The Vintage offers wine, beer, small cheese-focused plates, and the largest gourmet cheese selection in Long Beach. They are a one-stop shop for cheese and wine lovers; buy a pound of your favorite aged Gouda and a bottle of wine to take home or enjoy some triple-creme and a glass of wine on their pretty patio. They are also kid and dog-friendly (sorry, dogs are only allowed on the patio).

The name "The Vintage" has two meanings; a wine's Vintage (the year the grapes were picked) and Vanessa's (owner) obsession with everything vintage. The Vintage's tagline is "Libations, Bites, and Cheese," or "LBC." Libations, bites, and cheese are the three things Vanessa offers at The Vintage, and the LBC is the city we're located in (again, with the double meaning). A libation is often defined as a "liquid offering to a deity," but let's go with the simpler definition of a drink. Bites are small plates to accompany your libation, and cheese is self-explanatory. So, stop by and enjoy a little L, B, & C in the LBC. Did you know you can rent The Vintage LBC for private parties and events? The space is perfect for mix-and-mingle type parties. 
What we hope for is that you all continue to "love thy neighborhood as thyself." Support YOUR local businesses.
