

Hello Cal Heights Neighbors,

All summer long, my team and I have been busy with Concerts in the Parks, CD5-hosted Community meetings, neighbor-led events, and more, and it's been great to connect with so many of you. Let's keep the active community spirit strong as we continue into the rest of the year!

In Long Beach, August means budget season, as the City prepares to adopt the Fiscal Year 2026 Budget on September 9. We've heard the Mayor's recommendations and will continue to hear from City departments on their needs and priorities for the coming fiscal year at budget hearings throughout this month. You, too, can join the budget conversation and share your feedback and priorities by attending a Community Budget Meeting, like the one on Sat., August 16 at 10 am at the Wardlow Park Community Center, or by submitting a Digital Comment Card by August 21. Review the proposed budget and learn more at longbeach.gov/fy26.

Though the end of summer seems near with LBUSD schools back in session on August 26, there are still plenty of ways to enjoy the sunshine in the company of neighbors and friends right here in District 5. I hope to see you at the Los Cerritos Neighborhood Association's sponsored Concert in the Park at Los Cerritos Park on Wed., August 13; at the CD5-led Discover LBCC Community Concert at LBCC on Fri., August 15; and the next of our monthly CD5 Community Meeting series at the Wardlow Park Community Center at 6 pm on Thurs., August 21, where we will be joined by speakers from Long Beach Utilities.

Lastly, keep an eye out for some upcoming construction work this fall! Two major infrastructure projects—Carson St. from Orange Ave. to the railroad tracks at the city limit east of Cherry Ave. and Clark Ave. from Conant St. to Spring St.—are scheduled to begin this September with completion anticipated in early 2026. Be aware of posted signage and traffic impacts as the work gets underway!

Small Business Spotlight: Fingerprints Music

Psssssssst. Have you heard? We've just scored the coolest record store in town! Fingerprints Music has moved to our 'hood, and we couldn't be more excited.

Fingerprints first opened its doors in Belmont Shore in the summer of 1992, and landed at its new digs in April of this year. Owner-operator Rand Foster is already loving it here.

"It's amazing how supportive the neighborhood's been," Foster said. "Literally from the minute we opened the door. It's been really nice."

When asked to describe Fingerprints Music to people who haven't been there, Foster said this:

"First and foremost, Fingerprints is a record store, and everything that means—records, cassettes, CDs," he said. "We're growing our book section, and we have a pretty rockin' DVD, Blu-ray, 4K section as well, which people get pretty excited about. We buy and sell, so we come across a lot of stuff people haven't seen in years."

In addition to being a really great record store, Fingerprints has become known as a venue for high-end entertainment, including Brian Wilson, Jack Johnson, Cold War Kids, Matt Maltese, and Foo Fighters.

"It's also nice to bring in young artists who've come to tell us after-the-fact that our support early on made a big difference for them," Foster said.

Foster says he plans to work in tandem with neighboring businesses at this new location.

"We're doing some collaborations with Salud Juice over at Steelcraft, and we've been talking to Beachwood [Brewing and Distilling] about possibly doing something with them," he said.

All of that good stuff aside, Foster said what matters most is creating a haven for the people who visit.

"As a kid, record stores were my safe place," he said. "We want people to be comfortable here and feel like it's their record store."

Fingerprints Music is located at 3811 Atlantic Avenue in Long Beach. It's open Sunday through Thursday from 11





